What are “One-der-ful” Wednesdays?

“One-der-ful Wednesdays” are a time to come together as one for food and fellowship in the middle of the week. It is a time to study God’s word and have discussions in a small group setting. It may also be the time for choir rehearsal for adults and children or a time for St. Mark’s ministry teams to meet.

Adult Bible Study

“Discovering the Bible” invites adults into a new adventure of learning. The course explores biblical people, events, ideas and places, through reading, reflection, discussion, creative expression and discovery. For “One”derful Wednesdays we will be studying the Old Testament and will cover the following topics: Introduction to the Search, The Scriptures, The Beginnings, The Promise, The Exodus, The Journey, The Conquest, The Kings, The Two Kingdoms, The Prophets, The Exile, The Return, The Law, The Wisdom, The Visions.

The Resource Book for the course cost \$28.50 per student of the class. The course will run through May of next year. Dr. Gary Haddock, Dr. William Hollar, and Tim Carpenter will be team teaching the course. Participants need to wiling to make the commitment for the whole course to get the most benefit.

Literary Journeys

This course will consist of reading a wide variety of books or viewing various films to discuss and explore various themes in coming to understand more of who we are, how we are live, and the values and directives that inform and shape our lives. The first offering is: To Kill a Mockingbird, by Harper Lee. The group will read the book and view the film starring Gregory Peck (introduces Robert Duvall) to explore themes of how we encounter and relate to those who are different than ourselves, views on human nature, and justice. Shari Smith, local author, will lead the class. New copies of the book can be purchased for \$13.00 and used copies may be purchased for as low as \$8.00 from Amazon.com. The course will run for 6 sessions or more if needed.

Media and Ministry*
Jr. and Sr. High Youth will discover the gospel relative to their media-saturated world with the music, movies and games popular in their culture. We’ll reveal God’s presence or absence in today’s pop culture and how that relates to teenagers’ every day lives at home, school, work, or play.

Children’s Devotions and Activities

Children aged K –6 grade’s “One-der-ful” Wednesdays will begin with alternating Choir and Christmas Program rehearsals, kid-friendly devotions, and fun faith-building activities.
